- Create regular club newsletters and distribute them to local area businesses.
- Host, publicize, and promote open house events. Invite guests or local dignitaries to speak to generate internal and external enthusiasm and interest.
- Use Social Media (Facebook, Twitter, etc.) and your club's website to promote your club, contests, or special events.
- Utilize free advertising in local newspapers or magazines to advertize your clubs.
- Word of mouth. Invite friends and co-workers!

Keep an eye out for Toastmasters stories and events that could be of interest to the general public and tell me about them. And be persistent in your quest for publicity. Publicizing Toastmasters will bring new members to all of our D39 clubs.

Club Growth Development Team

Jill Fay, DTM, is serving as both the **Club Extension Chair** and **Club Coach Coordinator**. Ms. Fay tracks the progress of newly chartered clubs, new club leads, and monitors efforts by club mentors and coaches. Her report on the status of club leads, mentors, and coaches is attached.

Division Directors, or their assistants for Club Growth, serve on the District Club Building Team, and implement the District 39 marketing strategy.

The Club Growth Director is responsible for all aspects of marketing, club-building, and member - and club-retention efforts within the district. This includes:

- 1. Defining an overall marketing strategy for the district;
- 2. Developing outreach and retention efforts with existing community and corporate clubs;
- 3. Penetrating new markets; and
- 4. Supporting challenged clubs and helping them to become Distinguished clubs.

Experienced Toastmaster members form the *core* of the Club Growth Program. Division Directors, or their assistants for Club Growth, identify experienced members to serve as Club Sponsors, Mentors, and Coaches.

There will be a concerted effort to penetrate the underserved areas and businesses within District 39 that deserve the opportunity to experience the benefits of toastmaster membership. As the year progresses, leads will be developed in areas lacking a club.

2015-2016 Club Growth Goals

- Each Area will have one new club by June 1, 2016.
- All clubs eligible for club coaches will have club coaches by May 1, 2016.
- ❖ Increase membership payments from base of 6,488 to 7,008.
- Increase clubs from base of 178 to 193.

August Action Items & Goals

- 20% of clubs have membership paid by August 30
- ❖ Eight more clubs which were available for a club coach on July 1, have a club coach
- Prepare draft Marketing Plan
- Contact Club Sponsors, Mentors and Coaches to offer support and assess progress
- Attend District Leadership Training at the International Convention

September Action Items & Goals

- Expand marketing web page to include an interactive club/division location map, and clubs seeking club coaches, by September 30.
- ❖ 80% of clubs have membership paid by September 15; 100 % by September 27.
- Nine (9) more clubs, which were available for a club coach on July 1, have a club coach.
- Aid in preparation of District Success Plan & Budget for submission by September 30
- Complete District Marketing Plan
- Six (6) new clubs open by September 30
- ❖ Nine (9) clubs earn Smedley Award (5 new members = ribbon + 10% discount!)

CGD Team Successes

- Developed tracking system for new club leads, and Club Mentors and Sponsors.
- Established goals for Club Sponsors, Mentors, and Coaches.
- Provided training for Club Sponsors, Mentors, and Coaches.
- One (1) club (which was in need of a club coach on July 1) now has a club coach (Div. A).
