Let's make a commitment to share the benefits of the program, and make a difference in people's lives!

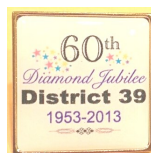
Welcome to TI's New Districts

Assign Your Club Proxy

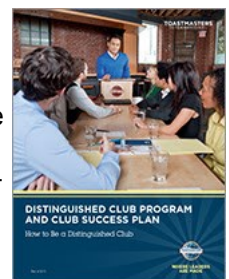
